SOURCES OF NEWS AND THE GOOD NEWS

When Pope Francis published his apostolic exhortation on love in the family *Amoris Laetitia* (The Joy of Love), the secular press followed its usual pattern when dealing with developments in the church. In particular, most reporters apparently did not read the exhortation carefully if at all, but rather focused only upon whether Pope Francis seemed to be taking one side or another (often simplistically and inadequately labelled conservative and liberal) in the difficult questions of how to deal with people who are divorced and remarried, or in other ways living in situations that fall short of Church teachings. The apostolic exhortation did deal with those questions, particularly in chapter eight of the nine chapter document. However, the exhortation describes a much broader Christian vision of marriage and the family that gives a great deal of encouragement and advice on the practical aspects of preparing for and living out family life, with regard to such things as marriage preparation, openness to life, self-sacrificing love, dealings with difficulties and struggles, the education of children, and prayer life. Based heavily upon the Bible, the exhortation is a call to heroism and unity with Jesus Christ and all of the people of God, not despite the struggles and sacrifices of family life, but precisely in the midst of them.

There is not space in one article to describe the points that Pope Francis makes in the apostolic exhortation. Rather, I would encourage everyone first to read the exhortation itself and then discuss it. In paragraph 7, Pope Francis cautions against a rushed reading of the document (which is precisely what the press generally engaged in), but instead recommends a patient and careful consideration of the points that it is making. For commentary on this topic and other ecclesial and religious news generally, I would recommend some good Catholic sources, including of

course the Vatican itself or the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, as well as such Catholic news services as EWTN, zenit.org, the National Catholic Register (where Jimmy Akin gave a good series of points on the exhortation), and the news service Crux. The last of these sources is independent, but receives its primary financial sponsorship from the Knights of Columbus. And in general, it is helpful to remember what C.S. Lewis says in Mere Christianity, "God is no fonder of intellectual slackers than of any other slackers. . . . Anyone who is honestly trying to be Christian will soon find his intelligence being sharpened." We should certainly be childlike in our trust in God, but we should also use our intelligence and resources to understand the faith and be very discerning in our approach to the world


We held our 3rd annual fundraiser for The Life Center of Page Valley the weekend of April 16/17 at Walmart.

Ultrasound Initiative

*Councils Provide Funds to Pregnancy Centers
for New Medical Technology*

A new ultrasound machine donated by Massachusetts Knights to Worcester's Problem Pregnancy Inc. was blessed by state chaplain Bishop Daniel Reilly in

On January 22, 2009, the 36th anniversary of the Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade decision legalizing abortion on demand, the Knights of Columbus launched a new initiative aimed at providing women considering abortion a new way of viewing the life within them.

On that day, the K of C Supreme Council matched funds raised by Knights in Florida and Iowa to provide two pregnancy care centers complete funding for the acquisition of ultrasound machines that will help the centers to provide for the health of both mother and child.



As of March 2015, numerous local and state councils have qualified for matching funds from the Supreme Council office towards the purchase of over 540 ultrasound machines at a cost of over \$16.1 million, with additional state and local council fund raising campaigns for ultrasound machine purchases either in progress or to be launched in the near future.

Ultrasound exams, which are medically indicated throughout pregnancy for a variety of diagnostic reasons, use ultrasound waves to scan a women's abdomen, creating a picture or "sonogram" of the baby in her uterus. Without K of C support, most pregnancy care centers would be unable

to purchase the ultrasound machines, each usually costing tens of thousands of dollars.

Before any fund-raising begins, review Qualifying a Pregnancy Care Center in Collaboration with the Local Diocese (#9885). Then, present the Diocesan Evaluation (#4884) to the diocesan culture of life director. After being completed and signed by the diocesan culture of life director, the Diocesan Evaluation form should be submitted to the Supreme Council's Culture of Life, Marriage and Family Values Office. After that office advises that the pregnancy care center may be considered for inclusion in the Ultrasound Initiative program, fund-raising may then begin, provided that the council and the pregnancy care center will also meet all of the other Ultrasound Initiative Guidelines.

State and local councils desiring to participate in the Ultrasound Initiative should refer to the Ultrasound Initiative Guidelines (#4885) for program requirements. Councils must raise half of the funds for purchase of an ultrasound machine before submitting an Ultrasound Initiative Application (#4886) to the Supreme Council Office for matching funds. The answers to some Frequently Asked Questions (#4873) provide additional information about the program.

The sophistication of today's medical technology provides a "window on the womb" said Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson. "Even from the early stages of pregnancy, a mother can see her developing child, hear the baby's heartbeat, and to recognize the miracle of the new life within her."

The Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Initiative seeks to provide medically certified pro-life pregnancy care centers with the modern technology to monitor the health of babies in utero, and to allow mothers to visually experience their development.

The abortion lobby is pulling out all the stops to prevent women from viewing an ultrasound of their unborn baby before an abortion.

You see, a nationwide study shows that 78% of abortion-minded women who see an ultrasound image of their unborn baby before an abortion end up choosing life.

In fact, we're seeing ultrasound images saving lives even in some of the most extreme instances.

A young lady took RU-486, the chemical-abortion drug, which she received from an abortion facility to abort her unborn child.

Fourteen weeks later an ultrasound was performed that detected a heartbeat. The baby had survived the chemical abortion.

And better yet, after seeing the ultrasound of her unborn child, the expecting mother changed her mind and decided to carry her baby to full term.

An ultrasound image is a picture that the abortion lobby is willing to do whatever it takes to prevent a woman from viewing.

That of course is why National Pro-Life Alliance members in all 50 states are fighting to pass legislation which will require abortionists to show ultrasounds to women before performing any abortion.

In fact, in the story I just mentioned, if a law had already been in effect, the abortion facility would have been required to perform an ultrasound and the mother may have decided then to keep her unborn child.

Your National Pro-Life Alliance continues to build up support for an Ultrasound Informed Consent Act to protect the unborn and give their mothers an opportunity to see the life inside.
